The Role of Metals in Ancient Greek History M. Yu. While this book does not pretend to be a definitive survey of the history of mining and metallurgy in the Greek world, it is a particularly useful interim report.

Studies in Ancient Greek Dialects Georgios Giannakis, Emilio Crespo, Panagiotis Filos, 2017-12-18 A new collective volume with over twenty important studies on less well-studied dialects of ancient Greek, particularly of the northern regions.
