He was the son of the founder of Mughal Emperor, Babur. The tomb was commissioned by Humayun's first wife Bega Begum, and designed by Persian architect Mirak Mirza Ghiyas.It was the first garden tomb complex built in India, which led to a series of other tomb complexes on similar lines; including the world-famous Taj Mahal. The tomb complex departs from the fairly modest tomb style of his father Babur in Afghanistan, and takes a great leap forward towards creating a model for numerous subsequent Mughal buildings and complexes.The site of the Humayun's Tomb complex was chosen near the Dargah of the celebrated Sufi saint, Nizamuddin Auliya, who was revered by the rulers of Delhi. The site also lied on the banks of the Yamuna River, which has since receded to a much farther zone. The Humayun's Tomb complex was instated into the list of UNESCO World Heritage sites in 1993, and has since undergone a dramatic restoration movement. It has been the part of one of the biggest monument revival movements in India, with the most dramatic stage being the replacement of the 6m tall finial on the top of the dome, after it was knocked down by a heavy storm in 2014. Today the complex is one of the most well maintained monument complexes in India, and witnesses an average footfall of at least 6000 people on any given day.About the seriesOut of the 1073 UNESCO World Heritage Sites (as of November 2017), Italy has the maximum number with 53.
